Welcome to the Eighth BRAYCE Newsletter

BRAYCE is celebrating its fourth year of facilitating cultural exchanges for young people in Brazil and the United States. Since 2005, with a strong infrastructure of partners: IBISS in Rio de Janeiro, ITAE in Paraty and Camp Hazen YMCA in the United States, BRAYCE has so far organized seven cultural exchanges. In Brazil, the real impact of these exchange experiences is measured by the returning program participants becoming inspired role models in their communities; assuming leadership roles in community projects; dedicating themselves to continue their education; developing the confidence to embark on a career path and plan a future. In 2009, with the addition of two Brown University students to participate in community projects in Brazil and with seven Brazilians traveling to the US, BRAYCE will have successfully facilitated a total of 16 cultural exchanges. The American interns will make a difference in the lives of many underprivileged, or at risk children, while enriching their own education and enhancing their prospects for graduate school, jobs and long term career opportunities.

Rio de Janeiro and Paraty Highlights

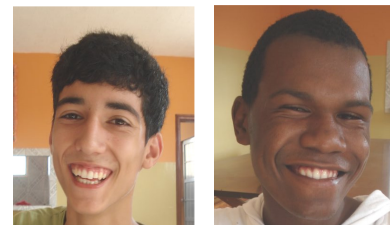
- Richard and Margot Calder visited Terra Encantada on several occasions to review progress at the Cultural Center and to observe and participate in the bi-weekly English lessons taught by Marlies.
- The Cultural Center (now known as Espaço IBISS) building renovation is almost complete and classes are already taking place. Daniel Sant'ano's class of twelve aspiring young guitarists, each equipped with a donated instrument, was very impressive.
- Jhonatan Cordeiro and Gilvan de Aragão were selected for Summer 2009 Leadership I training at Camp Hazen.
- Richard and Margot traveled to Paraty and were delighted to see the progress made at the new ITAE facility, still under construction.
- Pauline Batista, 2008 BRAYCE graduate, has been invited to return to Camp Hazen this summer as an assistant counselor. Once the new ITAE facility is totally operational in April she will be part of a team developing and expanding the language programs for parents as well as youngsters. She has already initiated English lessons for adults.
- Pauline received a special award from the Mayor of Paraty for her participation in the Camp Hazen Leadership Training Program.
- Richard and Margot met with ITAE Executive Director, Maria Helena Dantas. Maria Helena has offered an internship this summer for an American BRAYCE recruit to teach English and assist with many other program activities. The internship is for at least one month.
- Rafael Guerra held an orientation session for the families of Jhonatan and Gilvan. This was very well received and will ultimately form the basis of a formal parents support group.
- Pauline is developing a student manual to help new BRAYCE recruits prepare for the Camp Hazen experience. The manual is written in both English and Portuguese. A parents' manual is also in the works. This will explain the entire process of the cultural exchange from recruit selection to the ongoing commitments to BRAYCE, IBISS and ITAE.
- Nanko drove the Calders to visit the orphanage of Familia Santa Clara that is supported by IBISS. They presented a check donated by The Collette Foundation, Rhode Island, for renovation and supplies.
