Welcome to the sixth BRAYCE Newsletter

The year 2008 represents a turning point in the development of BRAYCE as we complete PHASE II of our American Brazilian Cultural Exchange. We are thrilled to announce that in addition to increasing the number of Brazilian participants from 2 to 3, we have recruited our first American student to travel to Brazil to intern in community projects administered by our Brazilian partners, Nanko van Buuren of IBISS and Marie Helene Dantas, of ITAE. This opportunity represents more of a peace corps experience with participation in community projects such as habitat, youth leadership and education. At the time of writing, the planning is not completed but we will report this in the next newsletter.

Recruits from Terra Encantada will be Rafael Guerra (invited back by Camp Hazen as a full counselor this year) and Eduardo Fares, a bright, fun-loving seventeen year old. Pauline Batista will join the group from Paraty. She is a bubbly, talented young lady who has extensive experience working with children and volunteering in her community. All the kids are overjoyed at the prospect of attending Camp Hazen and we, in turn, are thrilled to make it happen.

BRAYCE's first young American selected to intern in community programs in Brazil is Teresa Tursi from New Haven. She is currently attending Springfield College where she is majoring in Youth Development with a minor in Outdoor Leadership.
